## **FUNDRAISING FOR GIRL SCOUT GOLD AWARD**

Girl Scouts of Northern Illinois will support girls seeking outside fundraising (both in-kind and cash) for delivery of their Girl Scout Gold Award Projects. Solicitations for cash must be made in partnership with an adult Girl Scout (troop leader or Girl Scout Gold Award advisor). Requests must be submitted to the vice president of development and communications at the below listed address at least two weeks prior to solicitation in order to ensure that the request does not collide with strategies to raise funds for council-wide programs:

- Name of Girl Scout and adult making solicitation
- Name(s) of potential funding source (corporate/foundation only)
- Amount to be requested
- Purpose of requested funds

Requests will be considered and responded to in writing within one week from receipt. Once the council approves the funding request a letter of council endorsement will be sent to the girl. The endorsement letter should then be included with the solicitation.

All donations of \$250 or more must be received and receipted by Girl Scouts of Northern Illinois so that the donor can receive a tax-deduction. Donations will be processed within one week and a council check sent to the Girl Scout Gold Award recipient for the purpose of project completion.
