Summer Camp Position Descriptions

Camp Director – Responsible for the overall management of all camp operations during summer camp program with the expectation of providing an adventurous and memorable experience for our campers.

Assistant Camp Director – Assists with overall management of camp operations during our summer camp program with the expectation of providing a thrilling and exciting experience for our campers. Assistant Director will have the opportunity to practice leadership skills by serving as Camp Director at Camp McCormick during its short summer season.

Camp Program Counselor – Responsible for creating and implementing outdoor and specialized programs. They also oversee timely and professional implementation of these programs by camp staff. Programs may include STEM, cooking, arts and crafts, sports, nature/environment, and outdoor survival skills.

Counselor-in-Training (CIT) Counselor – Responsible for working with Counselors-in-Training (CIT's) to develop their individual objectives for attending leadership camps and service weeks. Ensure those objectives are implemented in an effective and efficient manner. CIT session only from June 5 – 30, 2023.

Business Administrator – assists Camp Director team through book-keeping, confirmation of reservations, ordering supplies, and file collection and storage. Assists in creation of camp newsletters, emails, and marketing materials.

Camp Medic – Responsible for the overall health and safety of camp staff and campers during our summer camp program. Also responsible for the general sanitation and safety practices throughout camp.

Waterfront Manager – Responsible for the overall coordination and implementation of waterfront activities including swimming, canoeing, and/or kayaking. Supervises Lifeguards

Camp Lifeguard - Responsible for overall coordination and implementation of waterfront activities including swimming, canoeing, and/or kayaking.

Head Camp Cook – Responsible for preparing nutritious meals, ensuring health standards are met, and accommodating to any food allergies and restrictions for campers and staffs. Assists in coordinating food orders and meal planning. Supervises all camp cooks.

Camp Cook – Responsible for assisting the Camp Cooks with dining hall operations to include season setup and breakdown, cooking, cleaning, food preparation, and food storage/inventory. May travel between Camp Dean and Camp McCormick

Camp Counselors – Responsible for working with campers to identify and plan the achievement of their individual objectives for attending camp with the expectation of providing an adventurous, thrilling, and memorable experience.

Overnight Camp Counselor – Supervises campers throughout entirety of overnight sessions; 3-day/2-night or 6-day/5-night.

Travel Camp Counselor – Supervises campers throughout entirety of overnight sessions; 3-day/2-night or 6-day/5-night. Travels with campers to off-site stables for horseback riding lessons at Camp Dean and transport Camp McCormick campers to many locations for Adventure Camp.

Junior Camp Counselor – Graduates of our CIT program; Junior Counselors assist in units as needed to supervise and seek adventures with campers.
