The Program Manager is responsible for creating outdoor and specialized programs. They also ensure timely and professional implementation by camp staff. Programs may include camp-wide games, arts and crafts, cooking, nature/environment, and outdoor survival skills.

Responsibilities:

- Create programs for all campers to boost confidence, independence, leadership, communication skills, and fun. Programs will align with Girl Scout badge requirements, camp themes, and interests expressed by campers.
- Run large camp gatherings and games such as all camp games, opening and closing campfires, fun meals, campfire cooking nights, Camper's Choice, rainy-day activities, and more.
- Ensure all activities and programming meets the Girl Scout program safety guidelines.
- Provide a safe and fun atmosphere for campers to explore, learn, and create while developing personally.
- Implements and evaluates camp activities and programing.
- Work side by side with other staff to ensure the success of their camp program.
- Assist leading or supervising additional camp activities such as swimming, cooking, arts and crafts, etc. Assist camp counselors by supervising campers during their breaks.
- Supervise counselors as they implement camp programming.

Responsibilities (Assists Program Team)

- Reviews programming outlined and created by Program Team. Ensures promised program is implemented.
- Develops, implements and assesses program schedule
- Develops, implements and assesses age-appropriate activities with input from Assistant Camp Director, CIT Director, Waterfront Director and Cook

Programming Development (Assists Program Team)

- Develops individual activities along with Program Director
- Trains staff in each activity
- Ensures program areas are clean and organized before and after each activity
- Ensure safe and appropriate implementation of activities
- Observes and evaluates activities and makes recommendations for change
- Ensures camper and adult surveys are completed and submitted to Council

Roles as Camp Program Manager:

- Assists with ordering and setting up program supplies and program areas before camp starts
- Organizes, inventories, and makes use of existing program supplies as best as possible
- Assists counselors with program activities and ensures they meet Girl Scout program safety guidelines
- Ensures program areas are cleaned and equipment put away after activity session
- overs for Counselors that are on break
- Fills in for other positions as needed
- Other duties as assigned. This may include but are not limited to: assisting all camp in opening and closing cleanup, assisting program and administrative staff in preparing for large activities, aiding kitchen during meal cleanup, stepping into roles outside of norm in emergency situations, joining another camp unit after your campers go home, relieving other counselors for personal breaks, facilitating activities for groups and rentals before, during, or post camp season, assisting in caring for camp goats, aiding in camp chores.

Activities responsible for assisting with include but are not limited to:

- Camper's Choice
- All Camp
- Themed programming
- Horse camp programs
- Nature activities
- Outdoor skills development (knot tying, shelter building, fire building, outdoor cooking)
- Arts and crafts
- Girl Scout badge programming based on weekly themes
- Facilitated activity scheduling such as archery, crate stacking, etc.

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
