Complete applications must include:

- Appropriate scholarship application.
- Two references using the 2026 Girl Scout Scholarship Recommendation form.

This form can be found on the Girl Scouts of Northern Illinois website and can be forwarded to the persons from whom you are requesting recommendations.

One reference must be from an adult Girl Scout member. The second reference must be from a non-Girl Scout adult, such as a teacher, coach, minister, employer, etc. NO family member references are accepted.

Examples: My Promise, My Faith; Community Service Bar; Service to Girl Scouting Bar; Safety Award; Torch Award; Take Action Award; Global Action Award; True North Award; Religious Award. This excludes Girl Scout Bronze and Silver Awards.

Girl Scout Leadership during your Senior & Ambassador years. *Maximum 4 points*
Examples: Camp Aide for Service Unit Day Camp - Summers 2023, 2024, 2025; Leading activities for younger Girl Scouts at council event; Counselor-in-Training I or II (CIT-1, CIT-2) - GSNI camps summer 2022 through 2025; Volunteer-in-Training, Associate Board Member serving term 2023–2024, or 2024–2025, 2025-2026, Committee Chair, etc.

Other Girl Scout Activities during your Senior & Ambassador years. *Maximum 4 points*
Examples: trips, events, troop money earning projects, Destinations, summer camp, etc.

A 450–500-word essay that details your Girl Scout Gold Award project. The essay must give the following details. Please be as specific as possible:

- 1) A brief description of your Girl Scout Gold Award Take Action project including the issue addressed (max. 5 points), its root cause (max. 5 points), and its national/global link (max. 5 points).
- 2) A discussion of what impact you made and who benefitted (max. 5 points).
- 3) A discussion of how working on your project strengthened your personal and leadership skills (max. 5 points).
- 4) How the project will be sustained beyond your involvement (max. 5 points).
- 5) What impact has this project made on you as you make plans for your future? (max 5 points).

Remaining 5 points will be based on essay structure. *Maximum essay points: 40*

- ☐ Scholarship funds are for use in the Fall of 2026. Funds not used will be forfeited. *
- ☐ Girl Scouts of Northern Illinois must receive documentation of enrollment in school or apprenticeship prior to funds being disbursed. *
- ☐ Girl Scouts of Northern Illinois has the right to award or deny a scholarship to an applicant. *
- ☐ A committee will review every application, along with essays and recommendations. *
- ☐ All finalists are required to have a personal interview with the Scholarship Committee tentatively scheduled for the second week of March.
